A copy of the actual Definite schedule will be posted at www.midatlanticdressagefestival.com and on the FEI website, www.FEI.org. It is also available to any FEI competitor prior to the show from the show secretary. Portal entry will be open with the FEI approval of the Definite Schedule. Entries for the CDI should also remember to enter the competition itself with payment in addition to the FEI Portal, otherwise their entry in the FEI Portal will not be accepted.

Qualification Specifications

Classes 500-711 will be conducted under FEI regulations. All horses in these classes must have appropriate FEI or National Passports. Classes 500, 600, 700, 501, 601, 502, 602, 702 are open classes. In the event these classes are over booked at Closing Date, horse/rider combinations will be accepted based on the following criteria, in this order:

- Any foreign horse/rider combination entered by their federation.
- Any horse/rider combination qualifying to compete for the US in a national or FEI championship.
- Horse/rider combinations that have previously represented their country in FEI championships and are entering at the same level as they competed in an FEI championship

Classes 506, 606, 706, 508, 608 are restricted to FEI Amateurs as defined in the FEI regulations – Annex 3 – Amateurs. An FEI Passport not required if competing in their home country. These horses must be registered with their NF, be identifiable by diagram, and have a valid vaccination certificate.

Class 701, Intermediate I Musical Freestyle: Participation for riders entered in the Intermediate I freestyle is limited to but not compulsory for up to the 15 best combinations from the Intermediate I competition who declared for the freestyle and who earned a minimum of 60%. A rider may start only one horse in the Intermediate I Freestyle.

Class 602, Grand Prix Freestyle: Participation for riders entered in the Grand Prix Freestyle is compulsory for the 15 best rider/horse combination from Class 500 Grand Prix (CDI3*) who opted for the grand Prix Freestyle as their 1st choice at the latest date of definite entries and who earned a minimum of 60%. A rider may start only one horse in the Grand Prix Freestyle.

xOn closing day, May 8, 2023, the entries will be placed in classes based on the above criteria until the classes are filled. All other entries will be wait listed. Entries received after the closing date will NOT be given preference over entries received by the closing date. Fees will be deposited when entries are received. Refunds will be given to those riders not accepted in the classes prior to the start of the competition.

Starting Order: A draw will be conducted each day to determine the order of starting for each class. The draw for Friday's CDI Classes will immediately follow the Veterinary Inspection on Thursday in the show office. The starting order for the Intermediate I Musical Freestyle, the Young Rider Musical Freestyle and the Junior Rider Musical Freestyle will be as follows: The rider/horse combinations are divided into groups of five with the group of riders placed 11-15 to start first and the best five in the last group. The starting order within these groups will be determined by draw. Draws on Friday and Saturday will be held in the show office at a time to be announced after the completion of the appropriate classed needed to determine draw groupings. A draw order cannot be changed. Once entered in a class, a rider may not withdraw, except as specified in the FEI rules. FEI rules provide for penalties for scratches without good cause.

CDI Classes

1. Prize and eight ribbons per class.
2. **Prize Money** – Prize money for Performance Division will be mailed to competitors within 21 days of the completion of the competition with proper tax identification. U.S. competitors will be required to complete IRS Form W9. Foreign competitors: the IRS requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the US. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form. No prize money will be awarded without proper tax information. **Failure to file proper tax documentation with the show office by the completion of the show will result in forfeiture of prize money payment.**
3. Failure to appear for an award ceremony will entail elimination of a competitor from the class. If a horse cannot participate in the Awards Ceremony for safety reasons, permission to enter on foot or on another horse must be given by the OC/FEI Steward/Ground Jury prior to the ceremony. Please be on time for your awards ceremonies. Failure to present will result in loss of classification.
4. **Best Turn Out:** Several Awards for Best Turn Out of horse and handler at the FEI Horse Inspection.

* No USEF/USDF memberships or Horse ID required for Intro Classes.

DEFINITIONS/ELIGIBILITY:

- **J - JR/YR** - Open to Juniors and Young Riders only; any rider is eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Only riders ages 14-18 may ride FEI JR Tests. Only riders age 16-21 may ride FEI YR Tests. Only riders ages 12-16 may ride FEI Pony Tests. Only riders ages 12-14 may ride FEI Children Tests.
- **A - AA** - Open to Adult Amateurs only; riders must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Must hold current USEF Amateur card.
- **CBLM** - Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship qualifying class for 2023. Riders must be members of a participating organization at the time of the show to be eligible.
- **USEF Q** – Qualifying class for 2023 USEF National Championships
- **Q** - Qualifying class for 2023 GAIG/USDF Regional Dressage Championships. *Declare qualifying ride on entry form.* Class fee plus additional \$15 fee *must be paid prior to start of the class.*

Non CDI Horses may stable in the CDI barn only with an accompanying CDI Horse and a current and valid FEI Passport, documentation of temperatures in the FEI Horse APP and all other CDI Horse requirements. They must pay CDI Stabling rates.

Only online entries will be accepted. Provisional ride times will be posted on www.midatlanticdressagefestival.com and www.horseshowoffice.com. Official ride times posted at 12 noon the day before show except CDI classes.

SHOW COMMITTEE: The show committee reserves the right to cancel or split classes; limit class size; change arenas; limit the number of rides & number of horses per rider; and cancel or add judges. The show committee also reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition. Numbers must be worn at all times when horses are out of their stalls.

USEF SAFE SPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENT: If you are a USEF Competing Member 18 years of age or older you are required to complete the core Safe Sport Training within 7 days of activating your membership. If you do not complete the training, you are ineligible to participate in all USEF activities including competitions. TAKE the SAFE SPORT TRAINING at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard.

ENTRIES: Accepted on electronic time stamp. Post entries (received after closing date) will be accepted on a space available basis with late fee. Once the competition is filled a wait list will be established. Wait list will be maintained through May 17, 2023. Current 2023 entry form must be used for signature pages and waivers. Proof of memberships and horse registrations must be included with entry. If entry is incomplete, horse/rider combination may be placed on the

wait list until required paperwork is received. Individuals utilizing the online entry system for this competition do so with the agreement that they have read the OFFICIAL PRIZE LIST and agree to follow all the class specifications, requirements and conditions in the OFFICIAL PRIZE LIST. All fees must be paid in US Dollars. Entry form also required if schooling only.

ALL COMPETITORS MUST SUBMIT WITH THEIR ENTRY CURRENT PROOF (WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF THE FIRST DAY YOUR HORSE ENTERS THE COMPETITION GROUNDS) OF EQUINE INFLUENZA AND RHINOPNEUMONITIS VACCINATION FOR ALL HORSES 7 MONTHS OF AGE OR OLDER. A CURRENT COGGINS WITHIN 12 MONTHS MUST ALSO BE SUBMITTED. In addition, if you are traveling ACROSS STATE LINES, Federal Law requires that you have a health certificate within 30 days of traveling.

EFFECTIVE 12/1/22: To be eligible to compete at Federation Licensed Competitions, coaches, trainers, and legal guardians signing as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing, Riders and owners are eligible for one (and ONLY one) Show Pass per year. Trainers and coaches are no longer eligible to participate under a Show Pass.

Attention Competitors: Each competitor is responsible for supplying the show management with the correct and required association numbers of USDF and/or USEF for the horse, owner, rider, coaches, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count towards regional or national awards. The proof of these numbers must be in the form of either their actual membership/registration cards or a facsimile of them. Proof of membership must be included with entry form. Please provide the USEF/USDF Master Verification (www.eqverification.org) although membership cards or photocopies of cards are still acceptable. Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership will result in competitor being charged non-member fees. USEF Show Pass Fees (non-member fee) must be paid prior to the competition and are only allowed to be utilized once per year. Members that are unable to produce the USDF memberships cards/registrations or a facsimile will be asked to sign an affidavit and pay an affidavit fee. Entry form must be properly signed with original signatures; an adult (18 or older) must sign for JR riders and on trainer blank. All entries are taken on a first come, first served basis. **Only one horse-rider combination per entry form.** Children, Pony Rider, Junior and Young Rider entries must include birth date on entry form. No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced, or remove them from the show grounds without permission of the show secretary.

Non-U.S. citizen participants entered in the open competition must send proof, in English, of current membership in good standing from their own NF, a photocopy of their 2023 USEF membership card, or must pay the USEF Show Pass fee prior to the competition (only allowed once per year).

CDI ENTRY INFORMATION: Coggins/vaccination records required for all CDI horses. Current FEI Passport required as noted above CDI class listing for all CDI horses. CDI entries must pay the FEI Drug Fee of \$30, the High Performance Fee, an office fee, and relevant class and stabling fees. Current FEI Horse and Rider registration required in addition to other memberships. Please enter the CDI via the USEF CDI Entry system in addition to a paper entry with valid payment information.

NON-COMPETING HORSES:

Must submit completed and signed Entry form to the Show Secretary, show proof of current Coggins, and pay N/C Horse fee plus Office fee. Grounds or stabling fees are also required. USEF/USDF fees or Late fee NOT required.

REFUNDS: No refunds after closing date or after the start of the competition for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather, non-compliance with SafeSport eligibility, or other emergency. GAIG/USDF Q fees refunded if request received before start of class until end of competition (unless applied to other indebtedness); otherwise will be paid to USDF. Refunds will be made before closing date less office fee.

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AT ALL TIMES. Owner will be fined – first offense \$50, second offense \$100 and a yellow card, third offense will result in the owner's dismissal from show grounds. All pets must be leashed. Non-compliance may result in USEF penalties and eviction.

Ponies: If ponies are entered in FEI Pony Test(s) or Pony Divisions and in need of a USEF measurement card, an appointment for measuring MUST be made with show management prior to the show. We will tentatively measure ponies

at 2pm on Thursday but other times may be arranged. There may be a fee of no more than \$100 per pony associated with measurement.

AWARDS: First Place prize & ribbons through 6th place. High Point Awards per division per day minimum. High points must be picked up at the competition by rider/owner or designated agent. Awards ceremonies for CDI classes only. Participation is mandatory 1st-8th place.

For CDI Prize Money distribution, please see the Definite Schedule, which is posted at FEI.org and www.midatlanticdressagefestival.com.

Federal tax law requires a W-9 from US winners and a W-8BEN from foreign winners claiming prize money totaling \$600 or more. W-9 information must match the payee. Every effort will be made by management to secure these forms and distribute Prize Money. If an exhibitor is unwilling to fill out forms, or provide a permanent resident address, prize money will be considered as a donation to the show.

STABLING:

All Stalls (including CDI Stalls) Permanent 12x10 sq. ft stalls with full sliding doors in center-aisle barns w/concrete walls. Arrival time is no earlier than 12:00 pm on Wednesday. If needed earlier, please contact Bettina or Heather. Layover Policy: For Sunday night must coordinate through the VHC Stable office and pay separate fee. **Stabling will NOT be posted!** Please check in at the Stabling Office upon arrival to receive your stable assignments. You **MUST** include an emergency contact (for the rider) and phone # on your entry blank. "Stable With" list and stall order must be emailed to show secretary at least seven days before show. No initial bedding. Bedding and hay available for purchase from VHC Stable Office. Preorders of five bags or more of shavings can be made by contacting VHC at 540-464-2966 or stableoffice@horsecenter.org but delivery prior to arrival is not guaranteed. Exhibitors permitted to bring shavings for personal use, but no fine sawdust allowed. Each entry **MUST** include stabling or grounds fee. Security on competition grounds day/night from time of arrival until departure of horses. Participants are required to complete a stall ID card, listing contact information in the event of emergency. **The VHC does not allow anything hooked to or suspended from electrical conduit in the barns.** Non CDI Horses may stable in the CDI barn only with an accompanying CDI Horse and a current and valid FEI Passport, documentation of temperatures in the FEI Horse APP and all other CDI Horse requirements. They must pay CDI Stabling rates.

Sharps containers are located in each barn. Per USEF rules, competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. All medical waste (needles, syringes, etc.) must **NOT** be discarded in stalls, manure pits, garbage cans or on grounds. All medical supplies **MUST** be placed in appropriate Sharps containers located in each barn.

Show office final hours will be posted outside the office on Wednesday but these are anticipated hours: 9am-6pm Thursday, 7am – 6pm Friday, 7am—6pm Saturday, 7am—1 hour after show ends on Sunday.

Freestyle entries You **MUST** be qualified to ride your freestyle by earning the necessary required scores (i.e. min. 63% for Training-Fourth Levels and 60% for FEI levels) at the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level from an USEF Recognized show with the exception of FEI Young Rider and Junior freestyles. Freestyles must be provided to show management on a CD or sent digitally with your entry as an MP3 file. Sound checks will be performed Thursday and/or Friday evening and during available breaks as needed.

Beginning in the 2016 competition year, which began on October 1st, 2015, participants and horses competing in **Para Dressage** classes at USDF recognized competitions will no longer be exempt from USDF memberships. Para Dressage competitors will now be required to have a USDF Group Membership, a USDF Participating Membership or a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$35 Non-Member fee per competition. Owners of horses competing in the Para Dressage classes will be required to have a USDF Participating Membership, a USDF Business Membership, a USDF Group Membership or a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$35 Non-Member fee per competition. The horses competing in Para Dressage classes will be required to have a USDF HID number or be USDF Lifetime registered.

Times: provisional times available at www.midatlanticdressagefestival.com and www.horseshowoffice.com and emailed to readable, valid email addresses. Official times will be posted at the show office by Noon the day before the start of the show. Numbers required all times when horse is outside of stall or not tied to a trailer. Entry required even if

schooling only (schooling fee and appropriate stabling fee). Anyone not appearing for any of their dressage tests without prior notification to the show secretary will be “scratched” from their remaining classes. Those rides will be filled if possible.

MATERIALE CLASSES

Judged under saddle as a group at walk, trot and canter according to criteria listed on the “USDF Materiale Class” score sheet. Horses must be at least 36 months of age to participate.

ARENAS: All dressage classes in 20 x 60 meter arenas, except Para Dressage Grades 1-3 and some eventing tests in the Eventing Dressage TOC, which will be held in a 20 x 40 meter arena. 1 inside coliseum ring, 2-3 indoor or outside rings surrounded by perimeter fencing. Indoor, covered and outside warmup areas/rings. Outside rings and warmups have silica/sand mix or all weather bluestone base/natural sand footing. Indoor and covered competition and warmups have sand/clay mix footing. Lungeing permitted only in designated areas – footing is a sand mix. All dressage competition arenas are enclosed in perimeter fencing.

HOSPITALITY: Food available on premises. Refreshments served during the jog on Thursday, we are offering a Wine Tasting with Snacks on Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning Brunch. There will be a breakfast cart cruising through the barns each morning and a Competitor Hospitality Table set up near the Show Office. Thanks to our sponsors for their support: Sheli King, Brooks Cushman, Edward Eubank, Virginia Equine Imaging and Loring Woodruff Real Estate Associates.

LODGING: Go to <http://www.horsecenter.org/accommodations.asp> for local accommodations. Camper Hook-ups on grounds with electric/water/sewer. Reservations required. Rate is \$45+ tax/night/space. Must reserve directly by contacting the VHC Stable Office at 540-464-2966. **DO NOT make camper reservations on your entry form. No camping in stalls at this show!**

VENDORS

Must submit application to the Virginia Horse Center. For vendor application go to www.midatlanticdressagefestival.com. Indoor and outdoor spaces available; trailers and tents allowed.

OTHER:

- All emergency numbers will be posted in/outside the Secretary’s office and in the barns.
- Hand walking will be permitted in the Coliseum and the East Complex around the outside of the show rings each morning until 20 minutes prior to the start of each show day.
- Riders may substitute horses once they have entered only upon presentation of a Vet Certificate for the incapacitated horse, or a bill-of-sale, and only in classes in which the first horse was entered. The Secretary must be notified 24 hours before the class(es) take(s) place, and a new entry form must be completed.
- In accordance with GR1301.7-8: Minors who do not have a valid driver’s license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver’s license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver’s license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed “unsafe use” if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- *All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events.*
- For current Great American/USDF Championship requirements, go to www.usdf.org/competitions/competitions-championships/regionals/index.asp
- **Under Virginia law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. CODE OF VIRGINIA TITLE 3.1. AGRICULTURE, HORTICULTURE AND FOOD, CHAPTER 27.5. EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, Va. Code Ann. § 3.1-796.130 (1994)**
- **Hold Harmless Clause** The Equine Activity Liability laws of the State of Virginia, VA Code Ann. Sec 3.2-6200-6203 state among its statutory provisions that , “NOTICE: Intrinsic dangers in equine activity, include (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant’s ability.” No Participant nor any participant’s parent, guardian, or representative shall have or make any claim against or recover from any equine activity sponsor, equine professional, or any other person for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting from any of the intrinsic dangers of equine activities. It is further understood that each owner, spectator, and other participants assume any and all risks of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions The Virginia Horse Center, USDF, USEF, its instructors, officers, directors, agents, show management, show committee, and all other horse show personnel.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

USEF SafeSport Requirements

- The required SafeSport Training is on the U.S. Center for SafeSport website and is free for USEF members.
- All USEF Competing Members (18 and older) are required to complete SafeSport Training within the first 7 days of joining or renewing USEF membership.
- The SafeSport Training requirement applies to all USEF Competing Senior Members even if competing in classes (such as USDF Intro or USEF Opportunity) where USEF membership is not required.
- Junior Members (under 18 years) are not required to complete SafeSport Training at this time.
- Any individual signing an entry blank as Trainer or Coach, must have completed the Safe Sport Training prior to the first day of competition.
- If SafeSport Training is not completed within 7 days of joining or renewing membership, and a completion certificate (for all three phases) presented to the show secretary on or before the first day of competition, the entry will NOT be allowed to compete.
- If SafeSport Training is not completed by USEF members and certificates provided to the show secretary on or before the first day of competition, there will be NO REFUNDS for entries. This applies to all USEF members (riders, owners, trainers or coaches) for any entry, including those classes where USEF membership is not required.
- Participants (riders, owners, trainers, coaches) who are NOT USEF members are not required to complete SafeSport Training.

- If SafeSport Training is overdue and certificates are not presented to the show secretary, or posted yet on the USEF website, the entry (horse and competitor) will be allowed to remain on the competition grounds but cannot compete.
- Competitions are required to check the USEF SafeSport Ineligibility list after entries are submitted and up to the first day of competition. Competitions that allow ineligible participants to compete are subject to penalties by USEF.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

USEF Membership Statement (GR901.9)

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Sharps Containers are located throughout the barns and one is also available in the show office. Please use them appropriately or fines will be assessed per USEF guidelines. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

Anyone who has a fever, exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, has tested positive for COVID- 19, or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 cannot enter the competition grounds. If any person on the grounds violates this requirement, competition management has the authority to remove the person from the facility.

Protective HEADGEAR RULE FOR DRESSAGE

Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration.



USEF SHOW PASS FAQs – EFFECTIVE 12/1/2022

Q. Currently riders competing in Academy, Walk-Trot, and Opportunity classes are exempt from USEF membership. Will these exemptions remain in place in 2023?

A. Yes, any classes or sections that are currently exempt from membership will continue to be exempt.

Q. Will the online show pass system at USEF communicate with show management software systems?

A. Yes, the USEF Show Pass information will be available live, in real time through the USEF API to show management software.

Q. Will the USEF API indicate whether someone is ineligible for a Show Pass if they have already paid for one for that year?

A. Yes, the USEF API will return information that the person is ineligible.

Q. Are riders, owners, and trainers all eligible for one Show Pass per competition year?

A. No. While riders and owners are eligible for one Show Pass, trainers and coaches are no longer eligible to participate under a Show Pass and must be an Active USEF member.

Q. Are parents that sign as the trainer or coach for their minor child exempt from membership and/or show pass?

A. No, anyone that signs an entry blank or acts as a trainer or coach must be an Active USEF member and is not eligible for a Show Pass.

Q. Are foreign competitors (citizens of other nations) with proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation required to pay a Show Pass?

A. No, non-US citizens who are members in good standing of their National Federations with proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation are exempt from payment of the Federation Show Pass fee.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top three riders

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or**
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

2023 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2023 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

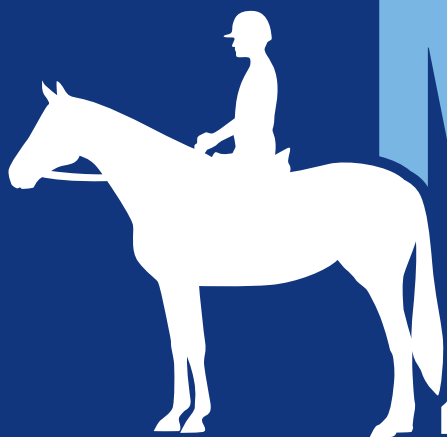

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").
